Dodd to Push Old, Reputable Firm Harder for Gun Controls

See, Vincent J. Dodd (D, Conn.) secretary served notice last week before House that ever his action as legislative liaison strengthening the Federal Firearms Act in the wake of the assassination of the President and two other athletes in Dallas.

But had it been on the books, Dodd told The Post yesterday, it would have made it far "tougher" for Lee Harvey Oswald to have purchased a mail order the imported rifle he required for 1123.
