Registration Inquiry - Oswald, Lee and Family (Your Memorandum
of June 12, 1952)

This mail contains Miss Cowan's telephone conference with Mr. Weaver on June 14 regarding the above registration case which he had referred to you on June 11. On June 5, 1952, and followed with a summary in memorandum on June 12.

On June 13, the family, consisting of Mr. Oswald, the registrant, his wife, Marlene, age 40, and boys, James, age 10 and 11, were met at the hotel's and worked. Since the family had only \$43, which was not sufficient for transportation to Texas, they were referred to the New York City Department of Health, Special Services Welfare Center, who helped them find a hotel for the night.

In discussing his situation with the Department of Welfare, Mr. Oswald gave the following information - in addition to the facts reported by you. He has a brother, Robert Oswald, who lives at 7315 Baypark Street, Bay Terrace, Texas. This brother works as a child-care worker for a milk company and "has not been paid money." Mr. Oswald expressed doubts about working arrangements. He said that he had completed his service in the United States Marine Corps and was in Texas with the State Department's approval to accept employment as a radio specialist. He was single for 2 1/2 years and married a Russian girl.

On June 14, the Department of Welfare wired and received \$200 from the brother, Robert Oswald, who agreed to meet the family on their arrival. Plans were made for the family's departure from New York as follows: leaving June 14, 1952, 4:15 p.m., Delta Airlines, Flight 021, arriving Dallas 7:15 p.m. It was estimated that the family's total resources will consist of \$200 to \$250 when they arrive in Dallas.

We appreciate your telephoning our regional office in Dallas regarding this case for possible assistance.
